

Your Spiritual Journey Now! September 19, 26 and October 3. 10:30 am Church Library Life Lessons, When Bad Things Happen, The Power of Now

Using the abstracts (or summary notes) from three wellknown spirituality writers, Pastor Chris invites us to delve into deeper meaning to be made in the power of this moment to transform your life.

Elisabeth Kübler-Ross, a renowned psychiatrist and author, presents *Life Lessons*, practical and spiritual lessons that urge us not to wait until the end of our lives, to learn lessons that we can learn now. She shares ideas to help us find greater peace and understanding.



Tragedy and loss are certainties. As we try to make sense of what's happened, we usually have a torrent of questions and emotions. Rabbi Harold S. Kushner presents *When Bad Things Happen to Good People*. Here we find a pragmatic approach to dealing with feelings and questions around grief and loss as well as a new understanding of how can God allow such suffering.

Eckart Tolle, a renowned spiritual teacher and author, presents his central teaching in *The Power of Now*. We are wired to fret about the past or the future, and these negative feelings and often false beliefs pull us out of living in the present. Hence, we waste precious time, and squander potential moments of joy and wonder. This reading can help us reclaim a deep sense of peace and well-being.

East Avon Cemetery Ground-Penetrating Radar Study to be Repeated – Date TBD - The East Avon Cemetery Association, in partnership with the Avon Historical Society, received a grant to conduct a ground penetrating radar study of a corner of the cemetery. Of interest was the area containing the stone honoring Pvt. Leverett Holden, a Civil War Soldier of the CT 29th Colored Infantry Regiment. Several church members attended the earlymorning information session on Aug. 12, 2024, with Jordan Tabolt and his assistant Kevin from Archaeological and Historical Services, Inc.

The soundwave information collected by the device that looks like a lawn mower will be analyzed on a computer. The results will show only disturbances in the ground, no actual remains. A report from the archaeologists at AHS Inc., is forthcoming. The questions it will answer include: is Leverett Holden's stone a memorial stone, or a grave marker? Are other unmarked burials in that area? We are seeking answers to these questions because Pvt. Holden's stone has recently been placed on the CT Freedom Trail, and a thorough examination of the area will help to document Pvt. Holden's life. Group photo by DeKey; others by Nora Howard.

The program fills bags with ready to eat foods that are distributed to 225 students at 12 schools in Hartford.
