
Building FaithNets with NAMI - NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) invites you to help build a FaithNet that encompasses the Greater Hartford area's communities of faith. FaithNets began in 1993 with Gunnar and Susan Christiansen from California, who had a son diagnosed with schizophrenia. Over the years, they became fierce mental health advocates to improve the world for those suffering from mental illness. Today, the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) supports communities to build FaithNets, which act as an interfaith resource network supported by people of all faith traditions.

The goal is to build a collaborative of diverse faith organizations to bring awareness and advocacy to the alarming rise of psychiatric disorders, particularly among Connecticut's youth population. By connecting youth, families, and the community to resources, guidance, and a safe space to explore, learn about, and discuss mental health concerns, we can make a difference.
