Background: Matthew Desmond educates us as to why poverty exists in America, how it touches all of us, and that there are ways to help eradicate poverty and create equity, starting with understanding the current crisis. This is the goal of the series: Many in town might not realize that, in Avon alone, roughly 5% or 1,000 of our neighbors live below the poverty level.
